Council won't OK rail pact

Tilo Cortez takes over as mayor

Under a new mayor, the City Council voted unanimously not to accept a proposed change to the city agreement

with the High-Speed Rail Authority. Tilo Cortez, mayor pro-tem the last year, took Mayor Alex Garcia's title at last night's City Council meeting. Garcia remains a councilmember after the annual rotation into the mayor's chair. Danny Espitia was chosen as mayor pro tem, and will become mayor late

The vote on the railroad agreement was taken after a discussion continued See CITY Page 3

WUESD in good financial shape

Wasco schools are in good financial shape, according the latest report of budget

The Wasco Union Elementary School District unanimously approved the first Interim Report representing the district's first

official revision of the 2019-20 budget. The report represents revised projections through the re-

mainder of the fiscal year ending in June, Chief Business Officer Karen Evans told

the WUESD board Tuesday night.

"The district is able to certify its first Interim Report as 'positive,' meaning all financial obligations for current and two subsequent fiscal years will be met," Evans

In addition, she added that changes to the General Fund at the report compared to the July Adopted Budget include the following: "The total General Fund revenue is now projected to be \$50,528,912, increased by \$1,915,004, and the Total General Fund expense is now projected to be \$49,973,811, increased by \$2,211,325.

'Staff certified that WUESD can meet its obligations for the current fiscal year and the two subsequent years," Evans added.

In other action, the board selected

Richard Reding as the 2020 board president and Anna Poggi as clerk, while board members Luis Fernandez, Danny Rueda and Cherylee Wegman are trustee

representatives. Additionally, Superintendent Kelly Richers also discussed the bond measure -

Measure C -- that will be on the next ballot. Richers stated that this \$16-million bond will be used to improve safety and the quality of the schools. "Most of our schools are old," Richers added. "We want to replace temporary portables with fixed classrooms, renovate all the schools by modernizing classrooms. and improve the safety of our

He added that there are three phases in

the measure: **2021.** \$5 million will be spent for the new athletic fields at Forrest and Palm Av-

2023. \$5 million to replace the portables at Prueitt and Palm Avenue schools.

2026. \$5.4 million to an alternative

school and the master kitchen. Richers also reported to the board that Internal Business Accountant Kay Espitia has submitted her retirement request, and the district has hired Rosa Hernandez as a new special education aide at Forrest Elementary.



Students in the Wasco Union Elementary School District are meeting state academic standards, according to Assistant Superintendent Dave Bowling.

John L. Prueitt and Karl F. Clemens have improved in math, while Teresa Burke and Thomas Jefferson have improved significantly in the indicators. The only school that has declined is Palm Avenue; however, that may change in 2019-20 due in the reconfiguration of the school from an elementary to a middle school. In another benchmark, Palm Avenue

increased in chronic absenteeism by more than 2.5% this year while Prueitt, Clemens, Burke and Jefferson decreased by 0.6% to less than 3%.

Prueitt, Burke and Clemens maintained

a low rate of suspensions, while Jefferson climate (culture) survey, parent and family and Palm Avenue both declined, Palm Av- engagement, and implementation of acaenue significantly

Bowling explained that the schools avoided academic probation this year, according to the 2018 Academic Dashboard. The dashboard is

demic standards. Bowling also stated that tests for

"The district recognizes that students coming from low socioeconomic home situations, English learners, foster and homeless students, and special needs students are the children most in need of additional support to find success at

According to Bowling, the dashboard is a step in a series of major shifts in public education in California that has raised the bar for student learning, transformed testing and placed the focus on equity for all

'The dashboard takes test scores into consideration, as well as the other areas that help make a student successful," Bowling said. "The dashboard provides information on the different indicators of school success based on data collected at the state and lo-

Prison PIO ready to retire after 25 years

Officer Martin Herrera is ready for retire-His last day on the job will be Dec. 26, after a career of 25 years with the State of

California Department of Corrections and

Rehabilitation. Foremost on Herrera's mind these days is the Christmas season, with the donations made by the prison employees to the children of Wasco elementary schools along

with his visits to the schools. "The prison staff donates Christmas toys through fundraisers throughout the year," Herrera said. "Only a few officers are able to go out into the community and deliver

Herrera was born in Blythe and his entire childhood was spent there. "Blythe is separated from California and Arizona by the Colorado River," he said.

He attended college in Blythe. After college, he applied to the California Highway Patrol and California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation in 2003 and in 2004 he was hired by the CDCR. "The entire process takes about a year," he said.

The first prison Herrera worked at was Ironwood Prison in Blythe. He and his wife both worked at the prison.

Herrera was attracted to the California prison system for several reasons, because they offered recruitment bonuses, benefits, paid holidays, advancement opportunities and annual vacations.

"I was working in a dead-end job, and the best move I made was to accept the offer from the state prison system," Herrera said. "Because of Blythe's remote location, not many recruits were selecting small vallev towns to work in." Herrera also worked at North Kern Pris-

on in 2000. He obtained a few years expe-

rience as an officer. In the mid-2000s, he

took the sergeant exam and passed. He was promote to sergeant in 2005 and relocated to Wasco State Prison. Herrera was promoted to lieutenant and public information officer in 2011. "I was open to new assignments and was given

several special ones." Herrera says that investigating crimes within the prison is very exciting. Those crimes are prosecuted by the Kern County District Attorney's Office, he said.

For Herrera, the most rewarding part of the job is being able to contribute back to the community as a public servant. "Another rewarding factor is knowing

how much people appreciate what we do,'

Herrera described the prison as its own city.

"Within our walls, we have a fire department, police officers, school, college, play yard, doctor's office, dentist's office [and stock] special medicine for major illnesses that happen here," Herrera said.

He also said that when talking about the rewarding parts of the job, "What comes to mind is the how my career has afforded and provided for my family." Herrera mentioned that he has encoun-

tered professional criminals and notorious criminals at different times.

He feels that one of the most important

According to City Manager Daniel Ortiz-Hernandez, the original agreement authorized the city to be compensated for staff and resources spent on the HSR project through Wasco by cost recovery. This agreement expires Dec. 31.

"Even though the original agreement was intended to cover the city's cost of staff and resources ... HSRA has changed the interpretation of the agreement," Ortiz-Hernandez said.

"Their explanation is that only certain activities were to be reimbursed by HSRA, while other activities are to be covered by HSRA's contractor California Rail Builders." Ortiz-Hernandez said.

The city submitted an invoice for \$84,184 and was asked to revise it to follow HSRA's instructions. Ortiz-Hernandez told council members that the city has only received \$46,243 from the bill.

HSRA asked the city to bill \$29,736.25 to CRB, even though the city does not have an agreement or documentation with the CRB.

Mayor Tilo Cortez questioned the Central Valley Regional director of the California HSRA, Diana Gomez, about the reimbursement. Gomez said that if the city signs the amendment, she will meet with the California Rail Builders and get them to pay the remaining monies due to the city.

We are committed to working with the city," Gomez said. "The contractor [CRB] has to pay the city."

"I don't feel comfortable signing the agreement before the city has its money reimbursed," Cortez said. He also feels that the contract is vague and not to the city's benefit.

According to Mayor Cortez, the city can have legal counsel work together to ensure the city gets paid back. 'It is our intention to pay the city

\$39,000," Gomez said.

In other council business, the Housing

Maximus Lopez, son of Dolores and Rigo Lopez, led the flag salute. to help pay for security at the site.

Authority asked the city for assistance in paying for security for the former labor camp due to a large number of break-ins. Cortez has been working to place everyone from the original camp into a permanent home. He is hoping this will be accomplished by March 2020.
