# License plate cameras coming to city

If you have wondered what those black poles going up around Shafter are, they are the newest aid in keeping the city of Shafter safe. The city has purchased 25 Flock Cameras to put up around town, placed in strategic locations throughout

The cameras are license plate readers, catching on record every vehicle that passes. The readers use technology that will aid the Shafter Police Department in

responding to crimes committed in the city by reading the plate and notifying the officers if the vehicle is stolen. The system updates every two hours, keeping the information current and viable.

Mayor Pro-Tem Cathy Prout said, "The cameras are not cheap, but they will be well worth it in the long run." The system not only reads the plates and records them, the officers can also use the system to monitor any city that has the system if needed. "There are 37 jurisdictions that utilize the

Flock Camera system, including Wasco, McFarland, Delano and Bakersfield," said Acting Chief Randy Milligan.

Milligan said that if the police need to check if a vehicle had been in a neighboring city, they can go into the system and view those other cities. There have only been a few of the cameras put up so far in the city, but, according to Milligan, they are already paying dividends. "We are already seeing the benefit of the cameras," said Milligan.

Prout was right when she said that the cameras are not cheap. Each camera carries a price tag of \$90,000. That makes

the purchase price for the city of Shafter \$2.25 million. There is also an annual maintenance fee for the system, which is \$75,000 for the city, based on the number of cameras that they have. But, as Prout commented, the department would spend a lot of money to have officers dedicated to patrolling the areas that the cameras would be covering, making the move a prudent one even with the hefty price tag.

According to Prout, the cameras are hypersensitive to the numbers on the plate, making it possible to catch the number clearly even if the vehicle is traveling at high speed.

# Measure X revenue outlook good

With higher city expenses expected primarily due to the new Police Department, Measure X revenues are looking strong, a city panel reported last

A presentation to the Sales Tax Oversight Committee April 23 shed light on Measure X, a local sales tax initiative crucial for the city's finances and safety. Led by Finance Director Isarel Perez-Hernandez, the session provided a comprehensive update on the Measure X sales tax, laying out a roadmap for the city's fiscal health and public welfare.

Perez-Hernandez shared that the projected revenue for 2023-2024 looks strong at \$3.1 million.

The measure began after Wasco's citizens approved it in November 2016, and it became effective in April 2017. Since then, it's been a game-changer for the city's







Shafter, and this will be great for the community, as well as the air quality," commented Maritn. The path will connect all of the schools in the city of Shafter, with the bike path making it possible for riders to make it around town without having to stray off of the path." This will not only be great for the kids and adults who ride their bikes, it will also help the air quality by reducing the emissions from motorized vehicles," added Martin.

These are just two projects that the committee has been working on for

Shafter, which was designated as a Disadvantaged Community by the State Air Board when the committee was founded. They also are working on a project that would include a charging station downtown for electric vehicles and also a station that would make electric cars available for residents to rent. These would be for residents who do not have cars but still need to go shopping, or doctors' appointments, without putting more emissions into the air with gas-burning vehicles.

Altogether, the projects are estimated to have a cost of about \$2.5 million.

income, starting from \$2.1 million in 2017-18 and peaking at \$3.3 million in 2021-22.

Looking ahead, Perez-Hernandez pointed out that expenses for the next fiscal year will be higher, mainly due to starting up a new Police Department. City Manager Scott Hurlbert emphasized that Measure X money mostly goes into police and public safety.

But Measure X isn't just about police. It also supports sheriff and fire contracts, neighborhood security cameras and upgrading the old courthouse for emergencies.

Moreover, Measure X funds are dedi-

cated to fixing roads, upgrading streetlights and making sidewalks more accessible for everyone. "This shows Wasco's commitment to making the city safer and easier to get around," Perez-Hernandez said.

Measure X benefits parks and animal welfare, in addition to safety and infrastructure. Funds will be used to improve parks, build better dog parks and construct a new animal shelter. At the end of the meeting, the com-

mittee approved the audit for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, showing confidence in how the city handles its finances.

"With Measure X, Wasco is not only ensuring its financial stability but also investing in the safety and well-being of its residents, making it a win-win for everyone in the community," Perez-Hernandez said.

City Manager Scott Hurlbert added, "Measure X is an important component of the city budget. The funds available through Measure X were critical in the po-

lice department start-up effort."

Sales Tax Oversight Committee Chairperson Flor Olvera said of the presentation, "The city staff is doing a good job of outlining everything for us as committee members, and I think the city council is doing its due diligence in the appropriation of those funds. It's also nice to see a big chunk going to the Wasco Police Department."

### **PASTOR'S CORNER** Loud blessings PASTOR RUBEN ZARTMAN

### Ebenezer Reformed Church, Shafter

Proverbs 27:14 – "He who blesses his friend with a loud voice, rising early in the morning, it will be counted a curse to him." In this proverb, we are faced with a man

who loves and likes and wants the best for his friend. There is one problem: The man loudly utters all that before his friend has gotten out of bed! And the horrifying reality is that this exuberant blessing turns into a curse because of that. The friend would rather have gotten some rest then received that loud blessing.

There is a sober warning in this comic situation: without wisdom, even good intentions can be destructive. It is not enough to mean well. Our zeal must be "according to knowledge" (Romans 10:2). It's good to have a warm heart, but that's not enough: we must also have clear heads.

This is not optional for Christians, but

a command from the Lord Jesus: "Behold, I send you out as sheep in the midst of wolves. Therefore be wise as serpents and harmless as doves" (Matthew 10:16).

That's a startling combination! It is not easy to be a snake and a dove at the same time. But both are necessary. And the loud man in Proverbs would have found it easier to be harmless if he had been wise. With some more wisdom, he would have realized that it's important to be considerate, as well as enthusiastic.

It may seem like just common sense not to wake someone up to tell them something that can wait. That loud blessing could have been spoken a little more quietly and a couple of hours later, and it would have served its purpose much better than it did. The Bible is in favor of common sense, even to the point of commanding it. If we want to be as harmless as doves, we also need to be as wise as serpents.
