County could be in yellow tier by May 12

The Kern County Public Health Department said Kern County could see a move to the least-restrictive yellow tier by May 12.

An article published by the Center for Disease Control stated that those who have been fully vaccinated may now go outside without masks if meeting with

family members, unless gathering in unknown groups where not everyone is vaccinated.

“California still has a mask mandate in effect that Californians are to follow,” Public Health Department’s Michelle Corson said. “The governor put a message on Twitter that alluded to the state following

in CDC’s footsteps, but they have yet to update their mask mandate.”

The total number of infected for Wasco on Tuesday, April 26 was 5,395 cases and the number recovered was 2,192 cases while the number of presumed recovered was 3,095 cases, which adds up to 5,287 meaning that 108 have not been accounted for.

The total number of infected in Shafter

on Tuesday, April 26 was 3,534 cases and the number of recovered on that date was 1,384 cases while the number of presumed recovered was 2,066 cases, which means 84 have not been accounted for.

In an address to the state last week, Gov. Gavin Newsom said he saw things drastically changing for the better by June 15 of this year and said that he was going to remove the tier system.

2 inmates escape from Lerdo, 1 captured

One of two inmates who escaped from the Lerdo Justice Facility was captured by the Shafter Police Department on Wednesday morning.

At approximately 1:30 a.m. David Reagan Palms, 22, and Tyrone Deangelo Johnson, 24, escaped from the facility. One Shafter resident caught Palms on their security cameras. With footage obtained by the Shafter Press, Palms walked right outside of the resident’s house close to 6 a.m.

At around 6:30 a.m. Palms was located by the Shafter Police Department and was captured after a foot pursuit. The officer chased Palms and caught him outside of the Dollar General store where he was taken into custody.

Later in the morning, a call was received by the Shafter Police Department that a resident had seen a black male in their yard in the area of Aspen and Montoya avenues.

A perimeter was set up and a search was being conducted to locate Johnson.

The Shafter Police Department is advising that anyone who sees Johnson not to approach him. Johnson is considered armed and dangerous and anyone who sees Johnson should call 9-1-1.

At press time, Kern County Sheriffs deputies had responded to a possible sighting and had several vehicles in the area of West Ash and Terra Vista in Shafter.

Ricardo Antonio Trujillo Acosta, Jr., 19, and Javier Mora, Jr., 19, died from the impact during the crash at the intersection of Highway 42 and Fresno Avenue. Suzette Lean Dobbs, 79, of Shafter, was the driver in the second vehicle and also died from the

impact.

On Saturday and Sunday, the Olvera, Tapia, Comparan and Reyes families held a fundraiser for both boys. Participants could get four tacos and a beverage and could make a personal donation to either one of the two boys.

“Ricky was my son’s best friend,” Flor Olvera said. “They were supposed to go to the beach this week-

end.”

Participants had a choice of Asada or chicken soft shell tacos with seasonings such as green onions, green sauce and limes and radishes.

“This was a true community and surrounding counties effort,” Olvera said.

A similar fundraiser was also held in Shafter for Dobbs over the weekend.

The accident is still under investigation.

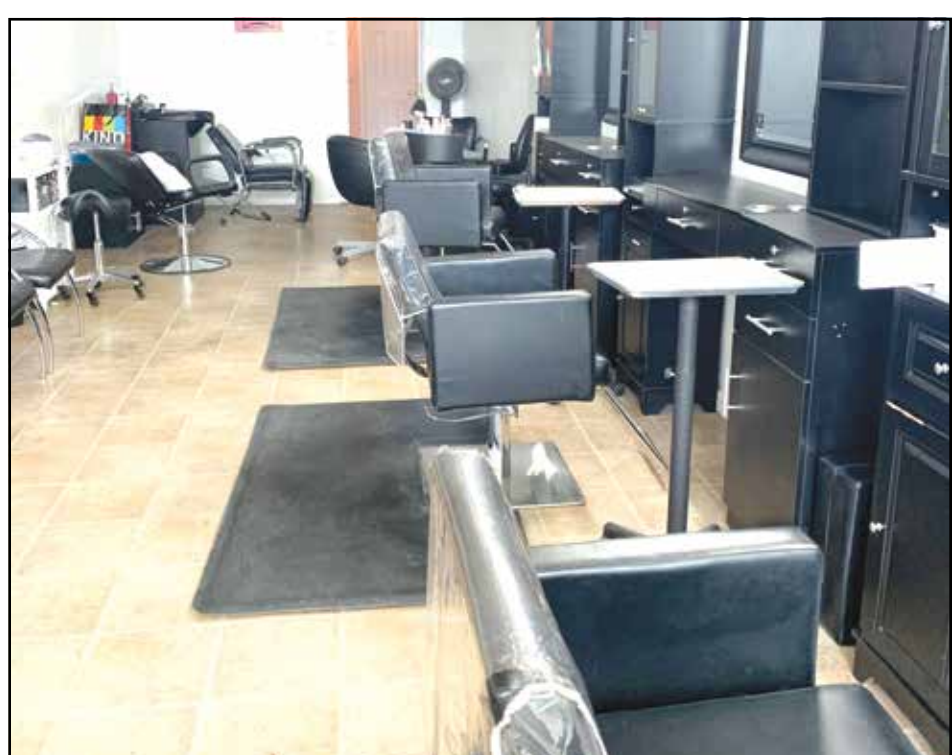
there, the commute to return to Wasco got to be too much, so she closed her Wasco shop."

Feedback wanted on city beautification

Residents are asked to fill out two surveys on the city website regarding beautification plans and what residents would like to see improved in Wasco.

Mayor Pro Tem Gilberto Reyna said the beautification survey is a multiple-choice survey and can easily be filled out through the city's website.

Also at the April 20 Task Force Meeting, the group received updates on a variety of projects including the High Speed Rail and the demolition of the former labor camp housing, the July 4th fireworks, recreation and parks programming and summer school.

Traci Mills Clendenen and Orquidea Ocampo reported on the High Speed Rail with respect to the demolition of the former labor camp housing. The two said

there is no update except they are waiting to hear from the HSR regarding its grant application, which includes the cost of demolishing the former camp. The city may not know anything until the beginning of May.

Reyna said the former camp is currently being used for several types of training for the Kern County Sheriff's Office and the Wasco State Prison, such as bomb and SWAT training.

The Orange Heart Foundation plans to transition the July 4th fireworks show to the Recreation and Parks District for 2021. The foundation will be hosting a lemonade stand and all proceeds will go toward the fireworks.

Assistant Superintendent of WUHSD Kevin Tallon said students can make up credits by attending summer school, which

begins June 1 for five weeks until July 2 from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

Tallon also said that something would be offered in the afternoons for incoming freshmen, but they will not be attending regular classes because there are too many current high school students who are in need of credits.

Sharon Sharp spoke on behalf of the Wasco Recreation and Parks District and reported that the district is working closely with the Reserve Baseball team. She discussed items that have been included in the new contract for 2021, which are a lowered fee for game entrance of \$5 per person per game and that the league is responsible for finding housing for the players.

Sharp also reported that summer camp at this time is not going to happen, but the district is continuing to review that option.

She said kickball and T-Ball are both full. On Saturday, May 1, the district will host an event at Barker Park called Primavera, which will include vendors, games and drawings. She said that the pool will be opening at \$2 a session as the district continues to discuss a date for reopening this summer and offering a family plan.

"We are also working on bringing back adult activities," Sharp said.

Reverend Marcus Ballard of New Generation Church on Central Avenue said on Monday, June 7, the church will be feeding 1,000 plates and on Tuesday, June 8, members will be cleaning up the city. On June 19, the church will have a Black History celebration with vendors and booths as well as food.

The next task force meeting will be Wednesday, May 12 at 4:30 p.m. Host Sam Estes said by June, the meetings could be in-person instead of on Zoom.

Bob Meadows, business development director for the city, said that this is a great deal for Shafter, made even better with the

Generals stomp Golden Valley, finish season undefeated

The Shafter High Generals football team ended their abbreviated season with one of the only three undefeated records in the county, going 5-0.

Their final game was on Friday night, winning against one of the other four undefeated teams, the Golden Valley Bulldogs, 41-14.

The Bulldogs tested the Generals' defense, with an early score that pulled the Bulldogs within 7-6 early in the game. Shafter came out and scored on their first drive of the game, which they had done in three of their four games to date this season. This drive ended with a 10 yard keeper by quarterback Tyson Dozier. Golden Valley answered with a score of their own, but they attempted a two-point conversion that Shafter stopped.

The Bulldogs would get no closer after that. Dozier and the team took another two drives in the first half for scores, using a ball control offense

that included runs by Walker Murphy and Dozier.

The Bulldogs hung tough for the first half, keeping the game within reach more than any other Generals' opponent this season. The Generals started pulling away with a tough-nosed defense and an offense that ate up chunks of the clock and finishing with a score.

Dozier used a variety of receivers in these drives, spreading the ball around to Cameron Huerta, Devon Sundgren and Nick Aguirre, while getting yards and first downs from Murphy and Elisha Lucero on the ground.

After Dozier scored again with six minutes to go in the game, the score was 34-14. A late score by the Generals gave them a final score of 41-14.

Although the Generals were flagged for 14 penalties in the second half compared to Golden Valley's three penalties, the Generals over-

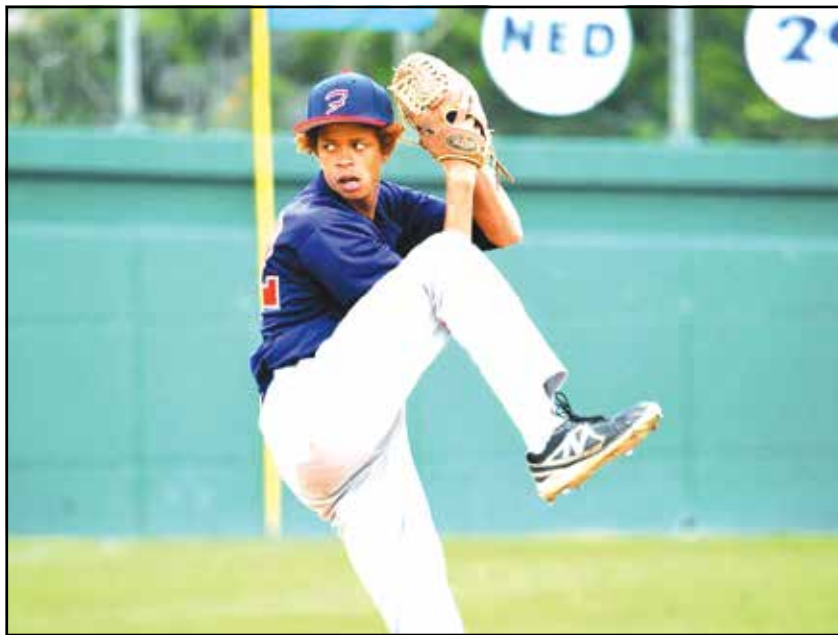
Jackson was born and grew up in Vallejo and Rodeo in the East Bay of the San Francisco Bay Area.

Encourage yourself in the Lord

Encourage – To give someone courage, hope or confidence.
Discourage – To deprive courage, dishearten, or be disapproving.
Life, itself, will discourage us at times. People will discourage us at times. We, ourselves, will discourage ourselves at times.
Many years ago, there was a young lawyer who suffered such deep depression that his friends thought it was wise to keep all knives and razors from him. During this time, he wrote, “I am now the most miserable man living. If what I feel were equally distributed to the whole human family, there

would not be one cheerful face on the earth. Whether I shall ever be better I can not tell; I awfully forebode I shall not. To remain as I am is impossible; I must die or be better, it appears to me” (Letter to John Stuart; January 23, 1841). If this young lawyer had remained in this depressive state, history may have never recorded one of America’s most beloved presidents, Abraham Lincoln.
Discouragement will come knocking at every door, while at many of those moments, encouragement is nowhere to be found. Sometimes, people in our lives will attempt to encourage us, but yet we know down deep, that many times they simply do not understand. What are we to do in those

times?
In the Bible, the psalmist David has some of the most encouraging words for those suffering from discouragement. Yet, the psalmist David, himself, was at times “greatly distressed.” It was in these discouraging times, that I Samuel 30:6, says, “But David encouraged himself in the Lord His God.” David served a God that helped him when others couldn’t and even when he couldn’t help himself. But both the Psalmist David and Abraham Lincoln would say today, “Let us renew our trust in God and move forward without fear.”

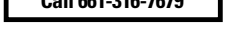
