Looking for new home for 'Barracks'

A historic building at Thomas Jefferson Middle School may be going home again.

Kelly Richers, superintendent of the Wasco Union Elementary School District, talked about an old building located at the middle school that has been called "The Barracks." He said that for the 16 years he has been with the district, he never knew why it was called that.

"I talked to TJ history teacher David Vaughn, and he advised me the building

was an original barracks during World War II that was located at Minter Field in Shafter," Richers said. "On Friday, March 22, the district was going to have it removed from the site in order to put up a shaded area for the TJ students."

Richers has spoken to the Minter Field Air Museum because he thought they might like the historic building back at the air base.

"On Tuesday, March 19, I received a call from Brigadier General [John] Stampfle,"

Homemade tortillas a favorite

La Nortena Bakery in Wasco is like no other bakery around.

Along with fresh baked goods, the bakery also provides a variety of items to its customers such as aspirin, toilet paper, cold beverages, hot coffee, homemade tortillas (both corn and flour), El Guapo spices, household items and, of course, freshly prepared desserts.

Upon entering the bakery, customers are immediately greeted with a smile and asked if you would like a cup of coffee. There is a small table with barstools nestled in the back of the bakery for customers wanting to take advantage of the offer.

Owners Enrique Gonzalez and his wife Candelaria Ceda have owned La Nortena Bakery for the past five years. Prior to that, Gonzalez worked in Bakersfield for a large company.

He opens the bakery at 4 a.m. every morning so he can serve the local farmworkers as they leave for work. "I want to give back to my community, and I do that by being open for them every day."

"Our most popular items are Mexican pastries and homemade tortillas," Gonzalez said. "You can get anything you need here."

In addition, La Nortena Bakery is open from 4 a.m. until 8 p.m. Monday through Sunday. "Yes, I'm open seven days a week,"

City joins crime task force

The Wasco substation of the Kern County Sheriff's Office recently created a Rural Crime Task Force and is now part of the Central Valley Rural Crime Prevention Task Force, which began in 2001, according to the KCSO's Robert Winn.

The rural crime investigation unit consists of one sergeant, two senior deputies, one clerk and a deputy district attorney. "This is a collaborative program in which

experienced investigators work directly with the Kern County Sheriff's Office," Winn said.

The Rural Crime Investigation Unit is a collaborative program designed to have experienced investigators work directly with those that have an interest in the agricultural, livestock and oil production industries.

According to Winn, there are crimes in rural communities that need to be moni-

tored and criminals apprehended, related to the county's oil, natural gas, hydroelectric power, geothermal, solar and wind power industries, as well for mineral wealth, including gold, borate and kernite. It's also important because the county's overall employment is ag-related. For these reasons, crime has increased and requires a specialized task force.

In the past, it was difficult to develop the

necessary investigative expertise to manage the cases with much success; however, with the new task force, criminals within the outlying areas are able to be monitored and apprehended quickly.

Law enforcement recognized the need to develop new and different strategies to address these crimes associated with the rural business community. Previous law



"The five minor teams are the A's, Yankees, Dodgers, Brewers and Blue Jays. The Dodgers, Giants, Angels and A's are the four major teams.





enforcement techniques were unable to keep up with the crime rate, and the criminals were not bound by city or county jurisdictions. Also, many times some crimes would be committed in one county that were also being committed by criminals who lived in nearby counties.

In order to address the growing challenges of rural crime, the Central

Valley Rural Crime Prevention Task Force was created. The task force has highly trained rural crime investigators from San Joaquin, Stanislaus, Merced, Madera, Fresno, Kings, Tulare and Kern counties. This task force is dedicated to enable new and more effective techniques for attacking agricultural, ranching and oil field crimes.

According to the Sheriff's Office, in addition, the task force works close-

ly with the district attorney's office on crime trends and evolving technologies. As a result of this partnership, the district attorney's office is able to develop legal tools to vigorously investigate and prosecute suspects.

The following officers are assigned to the unit: Sergeant Robert Winn, Sr. Deputy Richard Hudson, Sr. Deputy Tanner Miller, Deputy Corey Stacy, Deputy Richard Giannelli and Special Deputy Martin Downs.

dential. In 1916, Burke passed the teacher's examination and received her credential, but was too young to teach.

Her first teaching job was south of Bakersfield at Wible School. In addition to teaching she would cook hot meals for the children. At that time, drinking water had to be hauled to the classroom. Burke's salary for six months was \$80.

Burke arrived in Wasco to teach in 1920 as a seventh-grade teacher. At that time, there were only 10 teachers on the faculty. She began teaching eighth grade the following year and was made vice principal.

At the beginning, Burke had to handle teaching 40 eighth-graders, take care of the office, answer the phones, buy supplies and handle the discipline. In 1944, she was made principal of the primary building and was named curriculum coordinator for the district, a position she held for 14 years until her retirement.

Always interested in professional organization, she was instrumental in organizing the first local elementary school teacher's club, and was its first president. She was a past president of the Kern County division of California Teachers Association. She also served as president of Beta Zeta from 1952 to 1954.

During her career, she organized the first profes-

sional extension course that was taught locally for teachers in the area of remedial reading. Burke was a frequent member of countywide and statewide committees studying various aspects of curriculum.

She was a member of many organizations, including National Education Association, Delta Kappa Gamma and Central Section for School Supervisors and the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development. In addition, she was honored with a life membership in the Wasco Elementary Parent-Teacher Association, and was named Outstanding Woman of the Associated American University Woman, AAUW.

In addition, Burke was also honored for her many years of service by the Wasco Chamber of Commerce

and Agriculture. She was a director of the local Welfare Association. She served at St. John's Catholic Church for many years.

After her retirement, she served as a volunteer in the Mercy Hospital Auxiliary for 25 years. Teresa Burke has been described as a grand lady and an outstanding pillar of our community, and an excellent educator. In 2006 the district honored her by naming its new elementary school for her.
