Wasco awarded \$5M beautification grant

The City of Wasco was awarded a \$5 million grant by the Clean California Local Grant Program to launch its downtown revitalization efforts.

“The 7th Street Downtown Business District Rehabilitation and Enhancement Project has been in the works now for quite a bit of time. With this grant, we can move

forward with our vision to revitalize and beautify our downtown historic district, enhancing visitors’ experience, attracting additional community participation and increasing commerce. It’s a remarkable win for Wasco,” Mayor Gilberto Reyna said.

The California Department of Transportation announced the award of 105 local

projects, or approximately 30% of the 320 received applications, approved for nearly \$300 million in Clean California grants for communities throughout the state.

According to a press release, the 7th Street Downtown Business District Rehabilitation and Enhancement Project will transform the Downtown Historic District along 7th Street from G Street to D Street. Improvements include low water use land-

scaping, ADA compliant pedestrian facilities, shade trees, street furniture, seating areas, waste bins, enhanced lighting, new green space and art murals by local artists in alleys.

“There are four alleys that will be converted into parklets meaning no vehicles will be allowed to drive through them. Instead, there will be pedestrian walkways, artwork, new paving and landscaping. One

City celebrates expanded Learning Center

Two years ago, a group of community members, a local business and staff at the Shafter Learning Center met with a dream of expanding the Shafter Learning Center.

Flash-forward to two years later, and the City of Shafter, together with the Shafter Learning Center and GAF Roofing Materials, cut the ribbon on the new expansion.

On Wednesday, March 16, the public was invited to check out the new facility, with a new outdoor shaded space, along with new class-

Council evaluates proposed redistricting maps

At a special City Council meeting, the city’s redistricting consultant, Flo Analytics, presented draft map options with accompanying summary statistics for review. The council then narrowed the maps down to three.

According to a City of Wasco staff report, cities with by-district election systems must redraw their district boundary maps to comply with the California and Federal Voting Acts.

The process to complete the redistricting requires a minimum of four public hearings and dedicated public outreach to ensure minority populations and communities of interest are aware of the redistricting efforts and are provided with options to participate.

During the first public hearing on March 1, Flo Ana-

of the alleys is a little bit larger, and that one would have an area for live music events and room for a small children's playground," City Manager Scott Hurlbert said.

There will be a substantial rehabilitation of the 7th Street Park, including a small dog park area. The grant will be used for safety measure improvements and upgrades to the adjacent parking lots, including the only public electric vehicle charging station.

The project aligns with the city's goals related to safety, economic competitiveness, and quality of life.

"This project, and grant approval, is the result of community input, innovative design and tireless city staff efforts. It is an honor to have our project selected for funding in such a competitive environment," Hurlbert said. "It could easily be the end of the year before shovels actually hit the ground. Then, I wouldn't be surprised if it took a year for the project to be completed because we will be working around operating businesses on a busy street, and we want to be mindful of those businesses."

lytics introduced the online mapping tool for the public to submit their draft maps by March 17.

At this second public hearing, draft maps were analyzed for population balance deviation and other required criteria.

Every 10 years, cities with by-district election systems must use new census data to review and redraw district lines to reflect how local populations have changed. This process ensures that all districts have a nearly equal population.

The redistricting process for Wasco must be complete by April 7.

The City of Wasco adopted its current district boundaries in 2018, based on 2010 census data as required by law. The districts must now be redrawn using the 2020 census

data.

An analysis of the city's current district boundaries, adjusted for the 2020 census data, shows the districts are no longer population balanced.

District one is over 2,269 in population while district three is under 1,182.

"With this, we had some work to do," Alex Brasch, of Flo Analytics, said.

The draft redistricting maps were adjusted to comply with the targeted population range of 4,559 each. Draft maps four, five

and six were close to this target number.

"We want to maintain districts without change if possible as long as the population within the districts have no major deviation from one another," said Mayor Gilberto Reyna.

"Also, these presented draft maps do not move any of the current council members out of their districts," Kent Martin, of Flo Analytics, said.

Martin encouraged the public's input.

"Sharing your testimony at a redistricting hearing is a powerful way of shaping your city's district maps for the next decade. The more detailed and specific the feedback, the better," Martin said.

However, there were no public comments, and the public hearing was closed to continue with recommendations from the council.

City Manager Scott Hurlbert asked if any of those draft options out of all six resulted in any concerns over racial distribution or other metrics that Flo Analytics looked at across the districts.

"No. In all cases, the maps drafted comply with both the state and federal guidelines," Martin said.



Reyna said the council should move forward with the map with the least population deviation.

"In looking at the maps, I think we should move forward with the maps with the least population deviation since that is the goal," Reyna said.

Given that, draft maps four, five and six were recommended to continue with the discussion.

A motion was passed to proceed with the three selected for further consideration at the third public hearing on Tuesday, March 29.

The final map will be posted then presented at the fourth public hearing on Tuesday, April 5. It will incorporate City Council, public input and elements of the revised draft maps.



Author donates books to GROW Academy

Charles Hildebrand, a man who spent decades working and teaching in the Shafter and Wasco area, recently donated a group of books that he wrote to the GROW Academy.

Hildebrand donated copies of a series of books that he wrote, each containing a story that is geared towards middle school aged children, one of which is titled, "I Could Have Been a Hero, In the School Yard."

Hildebrand, who retired from the teaching profession years ago, has used writing as an outlet that keeps him going through some rough times.

"I would start writing a little bit, and before you know it, it is eight hours later and I had written page after page and I had lost all track of time," said Hildebrand.

Hildebrand being an author is a little ironic, considering that he grew up not being able to read. He grew up in the Tulsa, Oklahoma school system and got by on his quick wit, faking it when it came to reading, especially in class.

"I had to sound out words, and didn't comprehend anything that I was reading, just reciting the word that I could make out," said Hildebrand.

Finally, in high school, a teacher realized one day in class that he couldn't read.

This set off a series of tutoring sessions and long days and nights, helping him catch up to the rest of his classmates.

Upon graduation, he went to college as a music major. After school, Hildebrand enlisted in the United States Navy and was a part of the United States Navy Band.

After his stint in the Navy, Hildebrand began a teaching career that would see him teach, ironically, English and drama. One of the highlights of this time, according to Hildebrand, was his time teaching when GROW Academy was first opened up.

"I told Joanne, the principal at the time, that I wanted to be a part of this school. I would empty trash cans and clean the hallways if I have to. I just want to be a part of it," he recalled.

Through some rough personal times, including a hard divorce, Hildebrand used writing as an outlet for his emotions, sometimes writing until the break of dawn.

"I rented a room over on the coast and relaxed, sat down to write a bit, and before I knew it, it was morning, and I had written my first book," he said.

Hildebrand's first book was a murder mystery. This was followed by a book, "I Could Have Been a Hero." It was the story along the lines of the popular Diaries of a Wimpy Kid.

He was talking with an editor friend from Fresno State, Janelle Nagai, when she read the book. She suggested each of the chapters of the book would make a great short book on its own.

Flash forward a few years, and Hildebrand was talking with his friend and local author Barry Bongberg. Bongberg had found success with his own book, "Letters to Mom and Dad, From Vietnam."

Bongberg suggested to Hildebrand that he get the books published. Not knowing how to go about it, Bongberg helped him.

The series of 12 books is a labor of love, Hildebrand said.

"These are stories that anyone can relate to, be it a middle-schooler, or adult, everyone has gone through the things that these characters face," said Hildebrand.

He decided to donate the books to give back to the school that will always have a special place in his heart.

"I hope that all of the kids get as much out of the books that I did actually writing them. If it helps just one student, this labor of love is worth all of the effort," he said.

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Ronald McDonald House provides home for families in need

Throughout the United States and other countries, hundreds of Ronald McDonald Houses offer families great comfort while their children are undergoing treatments at nearby hospitals.

The organization's goal is to produce a "home away from home" for families struggling to care for their sick children.

"What we offer is important because we help families during a medical crisis. They don't have the added expense of traveling to the hospital where their child is cared for. It gets expensive, and we want to keep families close, making their lives a little better during a difficult time," Scarlett Sabin, director of the Bakersfield Ronald McDonald House, said.

Sabin has spent the last 14 years with the organization. "We opened here in 2009. At the time, we were the world's smallest house before it went under renovation in October 2018 and later reopened in July of 2019."

Before Covid-19, the house provided a home for almost 250 families a year. This past year they housed about 50.

"The house serves Wasco because the closest hospital they have for their children is in Bakersfield. Throughout the years, we have provided a home for many Wasco

families. A family from Wasco was with us for the longest record of time, with 126 days in 2010," Sabin said.

"My entire family stayed in the house when my daughter Khloe was born with Down syndrome," Liz Adams, based in Wasco, said. "It was a regular home, and we had all the amenities."

"It was an incredible experience because of how close the house was to the hospital. I could go at any hour, and we didn't have to leave her alone," she said. "Now we always try to give back to the house and support 'Runnin for the House,' to give that experience to somebody else in need."

Their biggest fundraiser, 'Runnin for the House,' came as an idea from Brad Maberly and Jill Rodriguez, both work in Wasco. With this, students get sponsored to participate in various physical activities.

"It gets the local community involved to help us raise money to keep our doors open. We talk about Wasco every year we hold the event because it was created there and has expanded all over Kern County," said Sabin.

Wasco resident Olga Ore-Sanchez knows the house well as her close family stayed there when their child was born with spinal bifida. She later became involved with 'Runnin for the House' as a Teresa Burke Elementary School teacher. "Now

all the elementary schools in Wasco participate," Sanchez said.

"It teaches kindness and helping others, which is aligned with the house mission. My daughter started in kindergarten, now is a senior in high school, and she continues to help. That is because the house has a special place in our hearts, and we are so grateful for all they do to help local families."

Since its inception, the schools involved in the program have raised almost \$500,000 in the last 12 years. Karl F. Clemens Elementary School kicked off the event on March 21st. "It was a great turnout like every year," Sabin said.

Other Wasconians have made a meaningful impact, like Danny Rueda.

"He was amazing. In October, we gave him an award for his dedication to the Bakersfield Ronald McDonald House and everything he did for us over the ten years he supported us," Sabin said. "In the end, kids need many things to battle their illness, but the steadfast presence of their families will always top the list. With togetherness, the rest can follow."

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF CAWELLO WATER DISTRICT DECLARING NECESSITY FOR LEVYING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS AND CALLING AND NOTICING A PUBLIC HEARING THEREON

WHEREAS, this District has heretofore adopted its budget for the year 2022, set water charges for the year 2022, and directed timely filing of its Annual Estimate of Obligations with the Board of Supervisors of the County of Kern prior to March 31, 2022; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary to raise by special assessments on a per-acre basis the sum of approximately \$3,543,030 in order to meet that portion of the estimated obligations of the District during the ensuing year which cannot be raised by water charges; and

WHEREAS, Water Code Sections 35539 through 35539.4 establish a procedure whereby this District can levy special assessments on a per-acre basis rather than on an ad valorem basis in order to cause just and equitable sharing of the District's obligations among the landowners; and

WHEREAS, this Board finds and determines that it will be in the best interest of this District and just and equitable among its landowners to levy special assessments for the year 2022 as set forth herein, pursuant to Water Code Sections 35539 through 35539.4.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of Cawello Water District hereby finds, determines, and declares:

- (1) A proposed special assessment of \$90 upon each acre of developed land within the District and a proposed special assessment of \$5 upon each acre of undeveloped land within the District shall be levied in order to meet the District's estimated obligations being filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Kern and in order to cause just and equitable sharing among District's landowners of District's obligations and in said budget heretofore adopted.
- (2) A public hearing on said proposed special assessment shall be held at 10:00 A.M. on April 14, 2022 at the office of the District located at 17207 Industrial Farm Road, Bakersfield, CA 93308.
- (3) This resolution shall be timely published pursuant to Section 6066 of the Government Code of the State of California in *The Shafter Press* and a copy shall be mailed first-class, postage prepaid, to each holder of title to land within the District as shown by the District's current assessment roll.
