Unique park within a park opens

The city of Wasco is working hard to provide a variety of activities for its residents during the summer months.

A ribbon cutting was held at Cormack Park, 1401 6th St., last week to introduce a newly completed Born Learning Trail.

Not many people knew beforehand what a Born Learning Trail was. In fact, resident Terani Hasha said she didn't know what was happening at the park as she drove by so she stopped to see what was happening and got caught up in the ribbon cutting with her children.

"This isn't a park I usually come to," said Hasha. "I've never heard of a Learning Trail."

Hasha arrived at the park with her

15-month-old son, Andrew, and 5-year-old daughter, Audrey Hathcock.

The park was divided into several different activity stations that allowed younger children to engage in simple physical activities. These included hopping, skipping sideways, listening to music, and describing how a flower feels and what it smells like using their own words.

Born Learning was introduced in 2005 by the United Way. The new trail is the eighth one installed in Kern County, said Jorge Haick, a computer technology employee at United Way who volunteered to help create the trail.

"We brought volunteers here to the park, assembled the posts with the signs (one side in Spanish and one side in English),



New facilities set path for WUESD

This year has been a very busy one for the Wasco Union Elementary School District. As Superintendent Kelly Richers finalizes logistics for the completion of several state-of-the-art buildings that will join existing WUESD facilities, parents start to think about how this will affect their children. Working alongside engineers, architects and construction workers, Richers must ensure a modern learning environment for incoming middle-school students.

The capacity of the schools will provide for growth well into the future.

8th grade schools -- James A. Forrest and Palm Avenue -- is being finalized and, under the supervision of Richers, construction workers plan to have the schools completed within the next month.

In 2010, *Education Digest* published "Gaining Ground in the Middle Grades: Why Some Schools Do Better," by the education advocacy group EdSource. Their study of 303 schools across California analyzed students' performance in school. Its analysis showed "success in key subjects in the middle grades is a strong predictor of success in high school and beyond." This illustrates

why it has become important to center specific attention on education around the 6th-8th grade levels.

According to Richers, there are two benefits from the new schools. First, the capacity of the schools will provide for growth well into the future. The student-to-teacher ratio will be dramatically lowered with the schools, too. The district is expecting that with fewer students to teach in each class, learning will be enriched, Richers said.

Wasco residents will immediately see a larger site for the MOT (Maintenance, Operations and Transportation) Center on the outskirts of Wasco. People that are delayed in getting to work during the morning rush will no longer deal with the influx of traffic downtown.

Richers stated that the schools' grand opening will be July 30, with the fall term starting Aug 12. While the two middle schools opening in August, the expectancy of the MOT inauguration will be no earlier than October.

and placed them in position next to the appropriate station.” Haiek said. “Working together with everyone was a rewarding experience as we all enjoyed getting to know people from other organizations by sharing ideas, meals and activities with each other.”

“The sidewalks were colorfully painted with artwork created by kids and volunteers,” Haiek added.

“This is just the beginning in the renovation of Cormack Park,” said Wasco Recreation and Parks district manager Vickie Hight. “The Wasco recreation board of directors and staff are working on a grant with the city’s grant writer, Sally Livingston, to seek monies to change the seven-acre park into a drought-tolerant landscape with walking paths, solar lighting, fitness equipment, dog park, t-ball

fields, basketball courts, soccer fields, hopscotch and four-square play area, and barbecue and picnic areas.”

Hight said the City of Wasco and the Recreation and Parks District held a joint board meeting on April 18 at which park renovations were discussed.

“This has been six months in the making,” Hight said. “We are hoping we are funded with the grant to really make a complete change at Cormack Park for our community.”

Hight also said the department is in the public comments portion of the grant process where residents are asked to share their thoughts and ideas of how to make the park better, with an email or by stopping by the office and talking with staff.

“We would love to hear from the community about what they would like to see

Hight shared that Aera


Energy and United Way partnered in this endeavor.





Council talks about police costs

Wasco Police Services requested continued coverage of operating costs at the City Council's budget meeting on Tuesday. The City of Wasco holds a contract with the Kern County Sheriff's Department to maintain and fund sufficient law enforcement services for the city. Any services offered by Wasco Police Services unit outside of that contract is covered by the City of Wasco.

"We want to continue covering those costs," said Interim Finance Director Santwan Tukhar.

One such cost was for the maintenance of in-car dash-mounted and body-mounted camera systems for law enforcement officers. These systems were implemented in 2012 and 2015 respectively and are beginning to fail.

Additionally, Police Services holds annual events to train officers in the specific traffic control needs of the City of Wasco and conferences on special narcotic training, said Tukhar. The proposed operating budget for law enforcement services was \$3,168,058.

Animal Control Services requested that the City Council include in the annual operating budget of the City of Wasco an allowance for improvements to the Animal Shelter and other services offered.

Representatives of Animal Control Services addressed the council last week regarding sanitation, safety, and organizational difficulties the shelter is facing. The council agreed to include an allotment of about \$5,000 in the operating budget for spay and neutering services, said City Manager Daniel Ortiz-Hernandez. The budget for Animal Control Services was \$272,250 before the changes were made.

The City of Wasco has only two drivers for the Dial-A-Ride services.

"We heard from a few residents who were there [at the council meeting]. There was a request to continue and, if possible, expand the Dial-A-Ride service," said Hernandez.

These residents petitioned for increased access to the transportation service after hours and on the weekend. The council considered hiring another part-time driver to fulfill these requests.

The City Council will vote to approve the operating budget at the next week's council meeting on Tuesday.

Suspects in assault on man, 75, in custody

The second suspect in the assault on a 75-year-old Wasco man turned himself into the custody of the Kern County Sheriff's Office last week without incident. Marvin Gray, 20, will face charges of robbery, elder abuse, conspiracy and battery with great bodily injury. The victim is now in stable condition. On Monday, May 27, at approximately 6:15 a.m., Wasco City substation deputies were dispatched to a report of a robbery. Deputies spoke with the victim, a 75-year-old male, who informed them he was on his morning walk when he was beaten and robbed of his

wallet and cell phone.

Deputies later determined the robbery occurred at approximately 6:00 a.m. in the 1000 block of 7th Street. The victim was transported to a local area hospital via ambulance. The victim sustained life-threatening injuries and was in a medically induced coma. Deputies located a surveillance camera that recorded the actual robbery and managed to identify one of the two suspects involved as 28-year-old Dabrae Dugan of Wasco.

Deputies obtained a felony warrant for Dugan's arrest, charging him with robbery, elder abuse, conspiracy, and battery with great bodily injury. On May 27, at approximately 10 p.m., Wasco substation deputies located Dugan in the area of Birch Avenue and 12th Street and arrested him without incident. Dugan was booked into the Kern County Sheriff's Office Central Receiving Facility.
