# Wasco undefeated regular season leads to conference title

When the game clock read 0:00 at the end of the 4th quarter, the (9-0, 6-0) Wasco Tigers were crowned the 2021 South Sequoia League Champions.

Led by Coach Chad Martinez, a courageous coaching staff, and a Wing T running game, solid defensive strategies, and

a host on seniors, the Tigers accomplished that feat in a win over the (5-5, 4-2) Shafter Generals, 46-20.

"The game plan was to start fast and beat them up running the ball," Martinez said. "It feels real good to be undefeated league champs."

Leading 32-12 at halftime, the Generals had every anticipation to reduce the 20-point deficit.

At 42 seconds into the second half, Shafter running back Elija Lucero ran the ball in for a 52-yard touchdown.

Wasco, who has been known to have fluent offense that moves the chains all season in every series of downs, for the first

time all season, the Tigers punted in their first two consecutive possessions of the second.

As the Generals continued advance the ball in Wasco territory all the way to the Tiger 30 yard line, the Tiger defense found a new surge of momentum that allowed Izaiah Juarez to force and recover a Shafter punt.

# Council signs with American Refuse for trash collection

The City Council approved a resolution to accept American Refuse as its franchise hauler to service the city and its trash collection.

The contract begins in March 2022.

The city needed to sign a contract with a hauler because of a state mandated order that all residents have a three curbside system for trash collection.

Public Works Director Michael James said the public will be notified about the new requirements that will be taking place. Information will be sent to residents in November and December, along with holding public workshops.

Beginning in March 2022, each residence will have a trash can for household trash, a blue can for recycling, and a green container for green waste. Each resident will be responsible for their cans. There will be no alley pickups with the new system as all pickups will be curbside.

City Manager Gabriel Gonzalez said the city's goal is to have all residents informed about the changes, before the Public Protest hearing, which will take place in February 2022.

Lynnda Martin, of American Refuse in Wasco, has given presentations to the council recently about the new requirements.

Martin has said the requirements are being put in place to better direct the waste that is generated by the individual cities. The state is mandating each city to have a required percentage of their waste be designated for recycling. With the growing number of organic waste recycling plants, the local schools have made progress in cutting down on their amount of waste that is entering the local landfill. Some are down to almost 1%, which is exceptional, even by the state's standards.

During the Public Comment session of the meeting Ed Gaede, a Shafter graduate, presented the council with

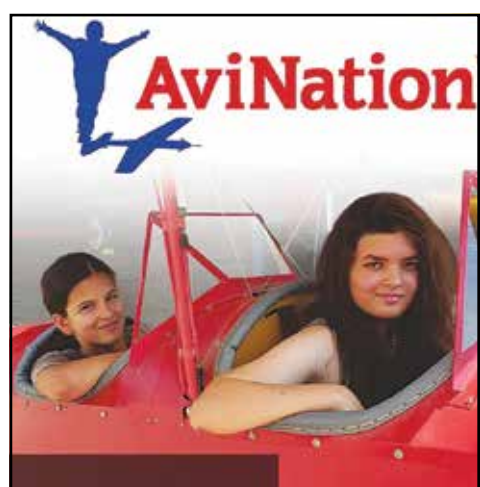
In addition to the aircraft, they will have a car show at the site. This show will feature classic cars, sports cars, trucks and military vehicles. There will also be a variety of food vendors.

Minnie Mouse and a carefully crafted clown with a red wig joined in the festivities.

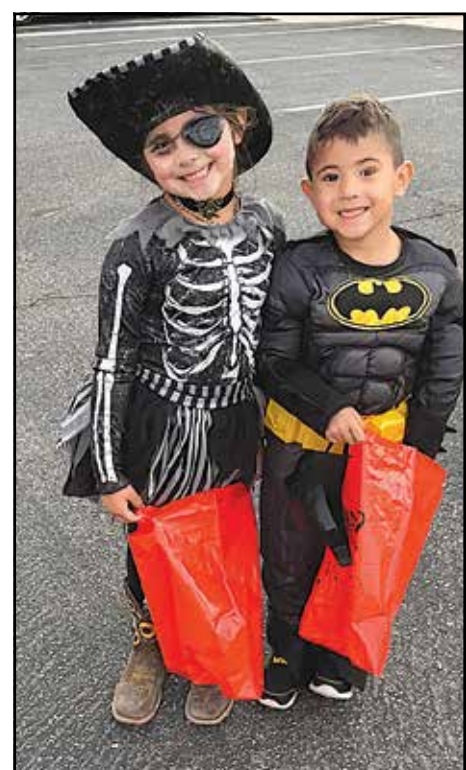
Minnie Mouse sisters dressed alike, but one was in pink with glittery eye makeup and her younger sister was in a red costume.

## Local man helping World War II legacy

A Shafter man has been working hard to make sure that World War II veterans are remembered in a special way.

The Kern County World War II Memorial will be built in Bakersfield at Jastro Park, at the site of the outdoor theater arena.

Ed Gaede, a Shafter High graduate, is the director of the committee that is heading up the memorial effort. Gaede has been involved in local veterans' causes for years on the committee that operates the Portrait of a Warrior museum in downtown Bakersfield.

After getting the authorization from the Kern County Board of Supervisors, the committee is moving forward and are hoping that the memorial will be finished by Veterans Day 2022.

"This memorial will be a great addition to the existing memorials here on Truxtun Avenue, including the Korean War Memorial," Gaede said.

Gaede said that they are attempting to have a stretch of Truxtun Avenue where the memorials are located named Avenue of Heroes.

"We were thinking maybe a sign when

entering that part of Bakersfield, along Truxtun Avenue, maybe something like 'Welcome to the Avenue of Heroes,' recognizing the effort that our county has taken up, making sure that our local heroes are never forgotten," Gaede said.

There are 487 veterans from Kern County that lost their lives during World War II that will be remembered on the memorial. One is a Shafter man who lost his life on

the USS Arizona during the attack on Pearl Harbor.

There are going to be flag poles in place with flags flying on them, with black granite slabs with the veterans names engraved on them.

Gaede said that there will be an opportunity for Kern County residents to have their loved ones' names on the back of the granite slabs, of veterans who fought in World

War II and returned safely. Those residents can sponsor a veteran for \$250, which will get their veteran's name included on the memorial.

"People can bring their sons, daughters, grandchildren, to the memorial and see their loved ones name on the memorial," Gaede said.

There are also larger sponsorship levels, including the Patriot level at \$250, which gets a loved one's name on the memorial, up to the General level at \$50,000. There are also going to be a few benches at the site, which can be sponsored for your veteran to be honored with.

Gaede said that Kern County has been very supportive to its veterans in the past, and he sees no difference in this effort.

"Kern County has been and will continue to be a patriotic community," said Gaede. "I'm confident our nonprofit organization will see a generous outpouring of public, private, corporate and in-kind support and donations to help build this reverent, long-overdue memorial."

In fact, area businesses are already stepping up to help.

Steve Ogden Concrete, for example, has offered to handle the concrete work on the memorial.

While discussing the July 4 fireworks show, she said the district worked closely with the Orange Heart Foundation because the foundation requested the district take over the coordinating of the fireworks show after 2021.

"We are so lucky to have partnerships with several different organizations and companies that continue to help the district with projects," Serna said.

At the present time, the parks are open for visitors. Next year they hope to be able to have more activities with the hope that the pandemic is over.

"We were lucky to have swimming this past summer, which included competitive swimming by our Tigersharks and free swim in the evenings," Serna said. "We follow all the state and county guidelines for safety."

# Booster shots available to those that qualify

If you are 65 years or older and fully vaccinated, you qualify for a booster shot, the Center for Disease Control announced.

If you are over 18 and have underlying medical conditions, live in a long-term care facility or live in a high-risk setting, you are also eligible to receive the booster shot.

## REGIONAL

Booster shots are now available for the Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson vaccines.

You can get a booster shot at least 6 months after you complete your second dose of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine. Or, you can get a booster shot of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine at least 2 months after your

first dose.

The CDC says that there could be an increase in reported cases of the flu this year, which could cause problems because hospitals are reporting critical shortages. One of the reasons for the concern is the CDC reports that a smaller number of people received the flu shot last year.

The new infection numbers in Wasco as of Nov. 1 were 6,586 compared to 6,468 from Oct. 28. This was an increase in a week of 118 newly infected.

Shafter's new infection number on Nov. 1 was 4,570 compared to 4,322, an increase of 248 newly infected in Shafter in one week.

The Kern County Public Health Department asks that everyone continue wearing masks and maintain a safe distance from everyone around you.

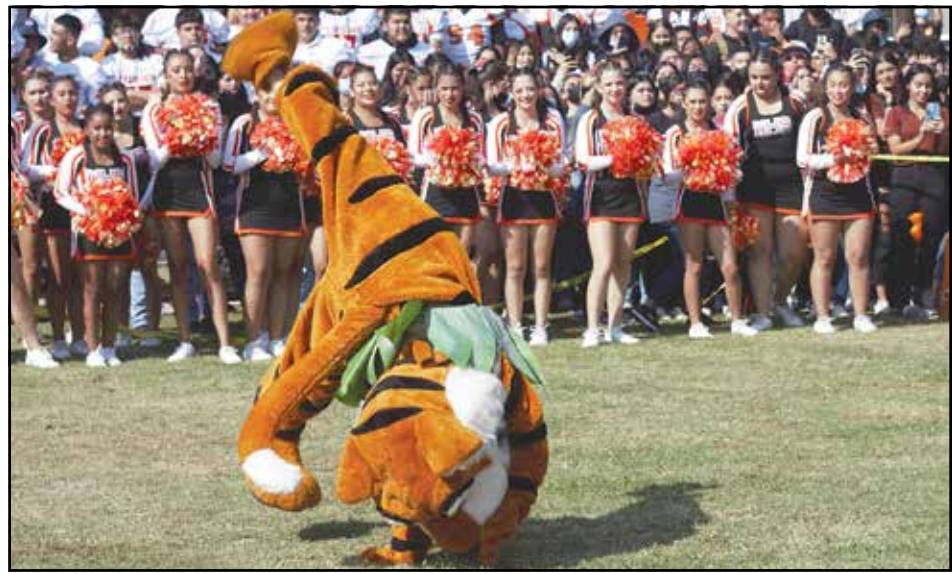

# Tigers beat Generals in rivalry contest

In the 94th battle between the Shafter Generals and the Wasco Tigers, Wasco used a hurry-up offense that eventually battered the injury-riddled Generals into submission with a 46-20 win. The game was a hard-fought one that saw the Generals stay in the game up to the very end, battling their way back each time they fell behind.

Shafter spotted the Tigers a 16-0 lead just minutes into the game. Wasco scored on their first drive of the game on a 9 yard run, followed by the recovery of an onside kick by the Tigers. Wasco then scored again on a long pass play, putting the Generals in a hole early. The game was played at Centennial High School, the Generals spending the season on the road while their new stadium is being renovated.

The Generals offense answered with a drive of their own, helped by a key third down play by Koa Rhodes and a scramble by quarterback Darren Sundgren. Sundgren was coming off a Kennedy game which saw him knocked out of the contest in the

second half. Sundgren didn't run nearly as much as in previous contests, most probably a precautionary measure to prevent further injury.

on an Elijah Lucero run to make the score 32-20. Unfortunately, the Generals couldn't mount another scoring drive, losing two fumbles in the third quarter that forced the Generals' defense to spend a lot of time on the field trying to hold off the Tigers. Wasco score midway through second half to widen the lead. Wasco capped off the scoring with a touchdown run with under two minutes to play.

The win gave the Tigers the outright

SSL championship. But, the victory may be bittersweet, as the Tigers were rewarded with a bump up in the Central Section division placings, moved to Division II and getting a #14 seed, which means a return visit to Centennial High School, this time playing the Golden Hawks in the first round of the playoffs.

Shafter received the #5 seed in Division V and will play Riverdale High School on Friday night in the first round.

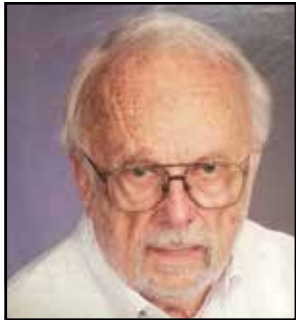

(Joe), Sharon and Annette (Alan); brothers Gregg and Craig; mother, Iola; best friends Richard and Chris; and numerous family and friends.

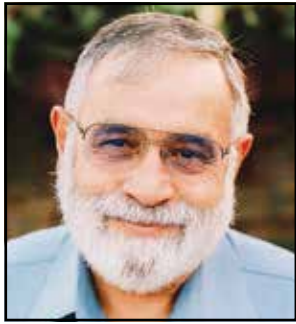
