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City Manager Daniel Ortiz-Hernandez resigns

Will go back to where he came from – Webster City, Iowa

City Manager Daniel Ortiz-Hernandez presented his resignation to the City Council Tuesday night.

He is expected to begin duties as city manager of Webster City, Iowa -- a city of about 8,500 where he held the same post

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from 2016 to 2018 -- at the end of July, according to a press release posted by that city.

Wasco city officials would not comment on the resignation, but aside from an email from Mayor Alex Garcia, it was obvious

they were surprised coming out of the executive session where it was discussed -- but "no reportable action" was taken.

"Tonight, the City Manager [Daniel Ortiz-Hernandez] informed Mayor Alex Garcia and the city council members that he will be leaving the city," Mayor Alex Garcia said in the

email. "I am always sad to see our staff leave Wasco. I am grateful for Daniel's dedication and tireless commitment to our city over the years and wish him the best in his professional endeavors."

Garcia added that he "affirms that community goals and other urgent pursuits" **See CITY Page 3**

The city entered into an agreement with the Kern County Library to open the Shafter Branch for two days a week until the end of June. After this agreement has ended, another plan will have

The library was not opened back up by the Kern County Libraries during the pandemic and the county decided to open different branches in Delano, Taft and Wasco.

Support for the library from the public resulted in the agreement that is in place currently.

"Our library is instrumental in the education of our young people, as well

as the adults who utilize the library," said Shafter Education Director David Franz.



such as the selection of the city manager's replacement will remain a top priority at city hall."

He said the city manager and council "are prepared for a seamless transition and look forward to finding the best fit for the community in the coming months."

Ortiz-Hernandez had relocated to California to be closer to family. Daniel and his

wife, Rachel, had two young children, ages 1 and 2 at the time. The Webster City posting said that after Daniel and Rachel each lost a grandparent "they wanted to provide an opportunity for the children to spend time with their grandparents and relatives during their early childhood years."

Webster City, in the same posting, said the city had been looking for a new city manager since December, but that search

had been "unsuccessful." Competition for a qualified replacement was difficult, with "the fact that there are several communities in Iowa and the Midwest searching for a City Manager at this time the City decided to take a break before starting the search again."

Apparently the city and the city manager have a deal to keep the reasons behind the move tight-lipped, though his new employ-

er was a little more forthcoming.

"Mr. Ortiz-Hernandez will not be making any further verbal or written statements about his departure," Garcia said in his email.

The Webster City posting noted that "when Daniel and his family desired to return to the Midwest, communication was initiated regarding the possibility of him returning to the position."

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The council also honored First Alternate Natalie Olvera, Second Alternate Jamilynn Eighthmy and winner of the Physical Fitness Award Malia Maldonado.

Morris will represent the city at the state competition in Bakersfield in July.

Terry Knight, of the Kern County Vector Control, also gave the council information on the upcoming mosquito season.

Knight advised the council of the new mosquito that has been plaguing the county the past two years. Known as “ankle biters,” this new species of mosquito named *Aedes aegypti* are very aggressive. Unlike the mosquito that carries the West Nile virus, which attacks during the evening, this new mosquito attacks in the daytime and can reproduce thousands of eggs in a bottle cap full of water.

Knight advised that residents eliminate any standing water around their homes, as well as wearing an insect repellent containing at least 25% DEET. Any products with a smaller amount of DEET will not be effective against this mosquito.

The council also approved the transfer of over \$415,000 in the Unassigned Traf-

fic Impact Fee Fund to award a construction contract to Griffith Company for the 2021 Express and West Beltway Roadway project. This project will widen Seventh Stan-

dard Road and will also construct a roadway that will connect Seventh Standard Road to Zachary Road and also eventually will travel to Highway 119.

Search continues for escaped Lerdo inmate

STAFF REPORT

A Lerdo Justice Facility inmate is still on the loose after he escaped April 28.

The Kern County Sheriff's Office is searching for Tyrone Deangelo Johnson.

Detectives and the Special Investigations Division are leading a thorough criminal investigation into the whereabouts of Johnson and into anyone aiding in the escape or assisting in concealing Johnson's whereabouts. Anyone with information is urged to contact the Sheriff's Office at 661-861-3110, Secret Witness at 661-322-4040, or 9-1-1.

The Kern County Sheriff's Office Professional Standards Unit is conducting a complete assessment of the facility to determine the circumstances of the escape and any flaws of the building or staff that need to be addressed.



On April 28, two inmates escaped; David Reagan Palms and Johnson. Palms was found and arrested last week at the Dollar General in Shafter on Lerdo Highway.

Johnson is described as a 24-year-old Black male with brown eyes, weighing 160 pounds and is 5 foot 7 inches tall.

Both men were charged with the homicide of 3-year-old Major Sutton, of Bakersfield, in 2017. The two masked men kicked down an apartment door in Bakersfield where their target was Crips member Rodney Gupton who was living with Major's mother; however, Gupton was not at the apartment that night.
