EX-SHAFTER CM HURLBERT NAMED WASCO CITY MANAGER

Former Shafter City Manager Scott Hurlbert will now be the new Wasco city manager, the City Council announced during its meeting.

When City Manager Daniel Ortiz-Hernandez told the City Council he would be leaving the city during the summer, the council members began seeking a replace-

On June 2, Hurlbert became assistant city manager under Ortiz-Hernandez and will assume the position of city manager on July 1.

Hurlbert's salary will be \$180,250. He is considered an "at will" employee. In addition, he will receive a monthly car allowance of \$600 that will compensate him for travel within Kern County. Hurlbert must remain accessible 24 hours a day for operational and emergency call-outs.

His contract is available on the city's website.

Hurlbert was the city

manager for Shafter from March 2014 to August 2019 when he retired from the position. Hurlbert is known for continuing the economic expansion through the addition of over 3 million square feet of logistics warehousing and the addition of the city rail container yard. He was also instrumental in the expansion of the city fiber optic network. He also helped establish the

Shafter Learning Center in 2014.

In November 2009 to February 2014 he was the assistant city manager for the City of Shafter. He was co-founder/president of Micro Track International from 1987 to 2005.

Ortiz-Hernandez also reported at the council meeting that the High Speed Rail Authority has not received word on their grant application yet, which would help the city pay for the demolition of the former labor camp housing.

Shafter council votes to create municipal library

The City Council voted Tuesday to disband the Shafter Branch of the Kern County Library from the county structure, creating a municipal

library run by the city in partnership with Bakersfield College, after the county ended talks to reopen the library.

In April, an ad hoc committee was created, consisting of Mayor Pro-Tem Chad Givens and council member Gilbert Alvarado, to explore options to keep the Shafter Library open past the current agreement with the Kern County Library system, which expires July 1.

The Kern County Library system closed its doors on any further talks of keeping the Shafter Branch open.

"It is really disappointing to see that the county has put Shafter as the lowest priority when it comes to its library,"

said Givens. "We are lowest on their list, but in reports we are third highest when it comes to foot traffic in the county."

There were three options for the council to consider.

According to the ad hoc committee, the first option would keep the 12 hour a week service in the county system, but the price would go up, resulting in a cost of approximately \$290,000 for the next five years. The county would keep the library open, but the city would have to pay the county for their services.

The second option was to pay the county to keep the library open with a

40 hour week service offered. This cost would be approximately \$930,000 for the five year agreement. With agreements made with the San Joaquin Library Association, for a library to use the Library Operating system programs, a Kern County employee has to be on site to run the software. This accounts for the majority of the cost that would be paid by the city.

The third option, after having discussions with Bakersfield College, would be to break away from the county system and create a municipal library that would be ran by the city and staffed by Bakersfield College.

Bakersfield College, with its willingness to help the city keep its library functioning, are prepared to staff the library 40 hours a week with the cost of having the library open for the next five years at a total cost of \$315,000.

'The drastically reduced cost compared to the county option is because of the generous offer from Bakersfield

College to partner with the city on the

project," said David Franz.

The third option was approved, allowing the city to begin official proceedings to break ties with the county.

"It is exciting. It is really disappointing to see how the county has chose not to consider keeping Shafter open, but this new venture is going to be a great one for the city and the community," said Mayor Cathy Prout.

Jim Ranger, who is a Bakersfield native and a contestant on The Voice, Season 19, will be performing on Saturday at 6 p.m. There will also be more live music throughout the day Saturday and Sunday.

The festival will take place in the middle of the only existing lavender fields in Kern County. The Lavender Garden is four acres of five different varieties of lavender. Their gift shop will also be open. The gift shop includes soaps, lotions, honey, essential

oils, diffusers, apparel, cooking ingre-

Lavender Garden is located in the northwest corner of Kern County, half-way between Bakersfield and the Central Coast. Descendents of the original three held on to the land, overseeing cattle and sheep ranching. Now, the youngest generation has opened the farm to visitors.

Generals helping students succeed with Pride Pantry

The Shafter Press About a year and a half ago, just before the pandemic hit the county, staff at Shafter High discovered

a disturbing trend. Teachers were coming to administration and counselors with concerns about some of their students. They said that there were students that were not coming to class on a regular basis, and there were also students who seemed to be struggling in class, as well as out of class. One teacher mentioned that a student was not coming to class because she didn't have enough clothes to wear, making it uncomfortable for her to at-

tend on a daily basis. Another example was a student who was missing

class because he and his family didn't have a permanent address and were staying with friends or relatives, bouncing around to

have a place to sleep. As similar stories came to light, a group of teachers wanted to help get these students back on track, in the classroom and outside

Katie Young took the reins of the problem and was determined to find a solution for the problem. Sabrina Macias, who is an intervention counselor at Shafter High School, said, "It all started with Katie. A group of us would sit and talk and voice a need to come up with a solution, but Katie is the one who got

the ball rolling."

The group began the Pride Pantry. This program contains a variety of items that students might need, as small as a toothbrush or toothpaste, to a bag of food, or a sleeping bag or air mattress.

Thanks to the support from local businesses, individuals and clubs in Shafter, the Pride Pantry has been serving the students of Shafter High to make sure that they are able to attend school and be productive students.

"This program is amazing, letting us help our students who might otherwise fall through the cracks," said team member Haley Ishida.

It has become even more challenging with families losing their jobs or homes due to the pandemic.

"We have seen a rise in the need for everything



On the 25th day of May, 2021, at the hour of 2:00 p.m., in the Chambers of the Board of Supervisors, in the Kern County Administrative Center, 1115 Truxtun Avenue, Bakersfield, California, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Kern adopted an Ordinance establishing the schedule of Solid Waste Collection Charges and the Recycling Surcharge for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 for commercial property located in Garbage Zone 1 of Unincorporated Kern County. This Ordinance establishes a schedule of all solid waste service charges for commercial properties by container size. Maximum rates are presented in Table A.

The maximum rates include the Solid Waste Administration Fee of \$0.40 per month which is charged per commercial unit based on provisions in County Ordinance and contracts with the individual haulers. The ordinance also includes the Recycling Surcharge which is based on container size. The Director of the Public Works Department has considered the environmental

impacts of this action and concluded that this action will not have a significant effect on the environment and the action is statutorily exempt from further CEQA review per Public Resources Code Section 21080(b)(8) and Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15273 of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines.
