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Harley comes home

A 1941 Harley Davidson motorcycle that was regular sight around the Minter Field Airport in the 1940s has come home, thanks to the owner's daughter, who donated the cycle to the Minter Field Air Museum.

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A ceremony was held on Monday, July 4, which is Vincent Anslinger's birthday. Anslinger was stationed at Minter Field beginning in December 1941, as part of the Army Reserves.

Fireworks show dazzles

The Shafter Chamber of Commerce held their annual Fireworks Show on Sunday night, filling the night sky with a display of color and explosion.

The event was held at the Shafter Recreation fields next to the Shafter High Football Stadium, which is still being completed.

The event drew a large crowd of over 2,000 people, with many others scattered throughout the nearby neighborhoods, holding cookouts, watching parties, and sitting in their yards, ready to watch the spectacle.

On the grounds of the baseball fields, there were vendors selling tacos, funnel cakes, drinks, shaved ice, and many other concession fare, adding to the festivity of the evening, which saw the night with a very pleasant 80 degrees. The Minter Field Air Museum was also there with their Yellow Follow Me Jeep, LOACH Helicopter and an antique fire engine, giving kids a chance to check the vehicles out and get their pictures taken with them.

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The fireworks show was free of charge, with donations being accepted. The event is made possible by the generosity of the many sponsors that assist the Chamber of Commerce in holding the entertaining show. "It wouldn't be possible to hold this type of show without some very generous sponsors, with the assistance of donations made by our generous community," said Chamber Director Adrian Monsevais.

Angel Martinez was on hand once again providing the sound and music for the event, keeping the attendees dancing and enjoying the wide array of tunes. The event drew attendees from all over the county, with people from Delano, McFarland, Wasco, Bakersfield, and surrounding areas. This was evident by the winner of the 50/50 drawing. A Bakersfield woman, Denise Maytubby, a friend of former Wasco Tribune Editor Toni Derosa, won the

\$1,400 that was given away. "This is my first time attending the show in Shafter, but it sure won't be my last. It was a wonderful show," said Maytubby.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Shafter's DYW Faith Balzadua, with a moment of silence following, for the fallen heroes who have given their lives for our freedom to celebrate this holiday.

As the sun set, the sky was filled for over 20 minutes with an array of fireworks that dazzled the attendees. The presentation was put on by nationally renowned company Zambelli Fireworks, who have been doing the show for over a decade.

The main event didn't disappoint, with numerous blasts of single and multiple bursts, lighting up the sky. "It was awesome," said Danielle Mendoza, who was here from Delano, with her three children. "I have been coming here for a couple of years now. We just love it."

Committee formed to explore Wasco police department

At this week's City Council meeting, Mayor Gilberto Reyna announced that he had formed a steering-advisory committee to look into implementing an independent Wasco police department.

"I have heard from many citizens who are dissatisfied with our current sheriff's policing services and want to see an immediate change," Reyna said in his remarks. "Worse yet, some are so frustrated with long-delayed or no responses that they have expressed a willingness to take

Anslinger's daughter Arlene contacted the Minter Field Air Museum recently wanting to donate her dad's Harley to the museum. She had the bike restored and thought that it was right to bring it back to Minter Field.

Anslinger was born in Indiana, and had enlisted in the Army in 1927, serving his country in the Field Artillery Division until 1940, when he transitioned into the reserve.

He met his future wife, Hazel Shanks, during this time. Anslinger had been stationed at Minter Field and lived in Bakersfield. He was seen daily riding his Harley Davidson to and from the military base,

The war ended right before Anslinger was to be shipped out to Europe. Anslinger then returned to Bakersfield, where he would live the rest of his life.

Arlene decided to donate the bike to the museum after some soul searching, and she acknowledged that it was one of the hardest things she has ever done, but she knows that it was the right thing to do, for herself, the museum and her father. Arlene contacted Ronald

Pierce, the director of the museum, where she told him about the bike.

A ceremony was planned for July 4, 2022, which would have been Vincent's 104th birthday. Anslinger had passed away in December 2012.

There was a pleasant surprise twist to the story when the museum had posted announcements of the scheduled ceremony. The museum received an email from a gentleman from Bakersfield that informed them that he had Anslinger's old airplane.

When questioned, Arlene said that her dad had become a pilot and had loved flying his beloved plane well into his 80s. Actually, the plane was sitting at the Minter Field Airport, torn apart having maintenance on it by the current owner. He offered to put the plane back together in time for the ceremony. Arlene said that she would love to see the plane and mentioned that she remembers riding in it a couple of times when she was a small child.

The red and white plane was there at Minter Field on Monday morning, as a convoy of motorcycles that had begun at the

Harley Davidson store on Seventh Standard Road arrived with the 1941 Harley that was making its way home.

Mark Welch, of the Harley Davidson shop, said that this was a special day. Ben Patton, another friend who was instrumen-

tal in the planning and execution of the event, said, "This is truly a piece of history, and we are so proud to be a part of it."

The motorcycle can be viewed at the museum, along with a few other artifacts connected to Anslinger.

matters into their own hands. I do not want that to occur, and we need to act decisively.

"The purpose of this steering-advisory committee is to answer what we need to do to start our police force, why we need to do it and how our City of Wasco can proceed. Public safety is our top priority. We will be providing concrete, actionable solutions."

Seven members comprise the committee: the mayor, Councilmember Vincent Martinez and community members Marcus Ballard, Rosalinda Chairez, Tracy Clendenen, Sharon Nicol and Orquidea Ocampo.

A resolution regarding the purchase of adult fitness equipment for the Central Avenue Neighborhood Park Project was unanimously approved.

In April 2021, the City of Wasco was awarded a \$2.2 million Urban Greening grant for the construction of a new park at the northeast corner of Central and Filburn. The concept design for the park included an adult fitness area.

The city's cost for the equipment will be \$35,000 plus tax, freight and a material surcharge. The special pricing is a nearly 40% discount from the normal state contract price and will be reimbursed by the city's Urban Greening grant.

A resolution was unanimously passed to accept a \$5,000 grant from California Animal Welfare Funders Collaborative Program.

This grant aims to reduce shelter euthanasia for at least 20 dogs and/or cats during the grant period. This would be accomplished by providing veterinary services, including but not limited to vaccinations, basic wellness, microchips and spay/neuter surgeries.

Sergeant Charles Shinn reported on statistics between May and June. He noted the following: CFS (calls for service) went from 849 to 777, total arrests from 54 to 62, citations (traffic/parking) from 31 to 34, patrol checks from 96 to 66 and narcotics-related cases from 30 to 13.

A special recognition was presented to Juan Gallardo of the Wasco Youth Wres-

ling Club and Wasco Wrestling Family for his dedication and service to the community empowering youth through the sport.

One of the students, Colby Clark, led the flag ceremony while others performed several wrestling demonstrations.

Juan Gallardo said, "I am blessed to be a part of these young men and women's lives. I appreciate Wasco High School for

allowing us a beautiful mat room for these athletes to have a safe place to come to."

"Thank you to the City Council for this honor and for being there for these kids by making the right decisions for the city of Wasco."

It was announced that a pet spay/neutering SNIP clinic was announced for Aug. 5 in front of the old courthouse. The time is to be determined.

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Football off to good start

The Wasco Union High School varsity football team took top prizes at the Hanford High School Passing Tournament and Line-man Competition.

"This tournament and competition is among the largest and most popular in the area. We played against six high schools from the Valley," said head varsity football coach Chad Martinez.

They won second place overall in the passing tournament. "We are not traditionally a passing team, so it is a good sign for the season."

Passing is a scrimmage that does not require pads like a traditional game. A scrimmage is practice game that will not count for the end of the season's wins and losses.

"It was really exciting because our players got a lot better. They showed great spirit and are starting to open their offense up, which will help us in the season," he said.

Martinez said they had a great group of guys last year, and this year they have another outstanding group coming through.

"We will do our best to get to where we left off last year."

Last year the team went undefeated in the regular season and beat Centennial High School, a division one school. "We

are Division Four, which meant we played a very good school," the coach said.

In addition to doing well in the passing tournament, they placed first in the line-man competition, beating Clovis East High School and Hanford High School.

The lineman competition is a series of events that the linemen go through that test their strength and athleticism.

"It was a good showing because we beat both teams, which are powerhouses in the Valley."

The season starts in August, when they will play Bakersfield's South High School.

"They were a playoff team last year. It will be a challenging game." But Martinez said they will be ready.

"We have continued to improve each and every day, and I'm excited to see this team's potential."

Playing on an organized team impacts the players for the better.

"I think it has a multifaceted effect on them. Their grades improve because they have to remain eligible, somewhere to be that keeps them out of trouble, and they learn many life skills."

The players put in much effort practicing Monday through Thursday for two hours a day.

"We never stopped training throughout the school year, and we started practicing again on the field as soon as school ended," he said. "We switched our training regime to incorporate more full-body strength exercises, which has paid off."

The players display a high level of commitment.

"They demonstrate this by showing up and working hard every day."

The team has big plans.

"It would be nice to repeat the wins we had last year. We have our work cut out for us because last year, we were one of the best teams in the Valley. We hope to continue the strong Wasco High School football legacy."

Their fan base is strong.

"The community is extremely supportive. Each of our away games last year felt like a home game because of their love for the football team."

Sponsors keep the team thriving; their many sponsors help buy spirit gear and always ensure that the boys are fed before they compete, as there are weekly lunch sponsors.

"We could not do a lot of what we do without our sponsors because they are always extremely helpful and assist us financially."

Team morale is high.

"Their confidence runs deep, especially after our recent wins where once again we showed that Wasco High School football has one of the best traditions in the Valley," says Martinez.

"It was clear right off the bat that we were interested in the same things," said Dyer. "We wanted to make the library modern and accessible for people. We had a lot of cool ideas, and everyone was on the same page."

I like to become familiar with all of them, helping them learn the dances they will perform with our cheerleaders at one of our football games," Coyle said in an interview recently.

The Bengals cheerleading team is composed of 2nd through 8th graders. At the camp, they honed their skills with the help of the Tigers.

They enjoy working with the Bengals and are happy to share their knowledge of the sport.

The Tigers include grades 9th thru 12th. It is one team with three squads, including freshman, junior varsity and varsity.

At the games, the Tigers dance, cheer, perform stunts and sideline routines, which are synchronized chants.

They cheer for the football, volleyball and cross country teams in the fall. In the winter, they cheer for the boys and girls basketball, wrestling and soccer teams.

"We cheer almost all year long," Coyle said.

The Tigers practice three times a week, Tuesday through Thursday. "They get up at 6 a.m. so we can practice in the morning before it gets

Tigers gain life skills from the experience.

"It teaches them responsibility, and we train them for their future. They learn to be on time and follow directions. In the long run, we know it will help when they apply for a job and for when they are hired."

They also learn teamwork and commitment.

"We hold them to the rules we put forth. They are all respectful students in class, and they must maintain their grades and work hard in school so they can have fun on the field and enjoy their extracurricular activities."

The Tiger team builds special bonds with each other.

"We assign a 'sister' to the freshman squad where a varsity cheerleader mentors her during the season and throughout the school year," said Coyle.

To pay for their uniforms and other related expenses, the Tigers host dif-

SPD works to keep Shafter safe, on roads and in neighborhoods

The Shafter Police Department is to keep the community of Shafter safe, be it on the roads or in their neighborhoods, working in eliminating dangerous situations, be they big or small.

According to Assistant Chief of Police Diana Barnett, the SPD issued four citations for illegal fireworks this year, and they responded to a total of 97 reports and complaints of illegal fireworks use.

This is compared to 150 calls last year and one citation given out. "This year was a lot quieter here in Shafter compared to last year. I believe that a

big reason is the proactive attitude of the department, with violators knowing that there will be consequences if they decide to break the law," Barnett said.

This sentiment was echoed by members of the community. "It was like night and day, comparing last year to this year," said resident Maria Torres. "Last year, it was like downtown Baghdad, I mean it was horrible. This year was a lot better."

In addition to the actions in the neighborhoods, the Shafter Police Department is also working to make the

roads safer, with two of its officers being recognized by the MADD organization for their arrest performances of suspected drivers under the influence.

At a ceremony recently in Bakersfield, Officers Maria Puente and Edgar Davalos were given awards for each of them having 11 DUI arrests this past year. "We are proud of our officers and their dedication in keeping dangerous drivers off of the road," Barnett said.

Officer Puente has been with the Police Department for seven years.

Officer Davalos is in his third year with the department, coming from the Kern County Sheriff's Department, where he spent three years as a deputy.

SOUTH SHAFTER UNIVERSAL SOLID WASTE COLLECTION CHARGES AND THE RECYCLING SURCHARGE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN:

On the **28th day of June, 2022**, at the hour of 2:00 p.m., in the Chambers of the Board of Supervisors, in the Kern County Administrative Center, 1115 Truxtun Avenue, Bakersfield, California, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Kern adopted an Ordinance establishing the schedule of Solid Waste Collection Charges and the Recycling Surcharge for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 for residential property with four or fewer units in the South Shafter Universal Collection Area. This Ordinance establishes a schedule of service charges for residential property which will be collected along with the County's property taxes and will become a lien on the property, if unpaid. The Ordinance establishes the maximum annual rates for universal collection for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 in the South Shafter Universal Collection Area to be set as follows:

South Shafter UCA Maximum Annual Fees	Effective Aug 2022
Residential Service per unit	\$258.61
Recycling Surcharge per unit	\$18.81

The maximum rate includes the Solid Waste Administration Fee of \$12.00 per year which is charged per residential unit based on provisions in County Ordinance and contracts with the individual haulers.

The Ordinance also continues the Recycling Surcharge per residential unit per year for all residential units.

The Public Works Department has considered the environmental impacts of this action and concluded that this action will not have a significant effect on the environment and the action is statutorily exempt from further CEQA review per Public Resources Code Section 21080(b)(8) and Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15273 of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines.

The Engineer's Report contains, among other things, a general description of the public services to be performed, an estimate of the costs thereof and identical costs and expenses in connection therewith, an assessment diagram of the above Landscaping and Lighting Maintenance Districts and the boundaries and dimensions of the separate parcels of land therein.

At the public hearing any interested person will be permitted to present written or oral testimony. Copies of documents related to the above project are on file and available for review at the City Clerk's Office at City Hall, 336 Pacific Ave., Shafter, CA.
